REFORMING OUR MILITARY

America's military is stretched thin by two prolonged wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. To better prepare our military to fight terrorism in the 21st century, we must focus on developing counterinsurgency capabilities and expanding the ranks of those soldiers who fill crucial roles. This means remedying the lack of foreign language specialists, increasing the technological literacy of all members of the armed services, and ending discriminatory practices, such as "Don't Ask, Don't Tell," which cause our military to lose soldiers who are critical to the mission of defending America.

NUCLEAR NON-PROLIFERATION

Rudy Moise believes that focusing on the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons and a reduction of the nuclear weapon arsenal is a major priority because the presence of nuclear weapons is a threat to the security of America and the world. He believes in working with other nations, particularly those states of the former Soviet Union, to reduce the existing number of nuclear weapons and to ensure the security of those remnants

of the Cold War that are at risk of falling into the wrong hands. The United States and other leading countries should continue working together to prevent terrorists and rogue nations, especially Iran and North Korea, from obtaining or creating nuclear weapons.

INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMACY

Rudy Moise believes that diplomacy should be America's first line of defense against potential international conflict. Preempting and preventing conflicts through reasoned negotiation yields the greatest possibility of bringing about long-term success. Rudy supports President Obama and Secretary Clinton's efforts to restore America's image abroad through diplomacy. He believes that these strong diplomatic ties are essential in gaining international support and restoring America international integrity.
